## SCAM/FRAUD INCIDENT

Earlier today, UPD was contacted by a person who reported being the victim of a phone scam fraud. The person received a telephone call and their Caller ID revealed that the number was originating from a "USF St. Petersburg" telephone utilizing the 873 exchange number. The recorded message made reference to "lowering credit card interest rates" and then connected the person to a representative, who asked for additional personal financial information.

Often these frauds are perpetrated by displaying a recognizable telephone number on the Caller ID ("spoofing") in hopes of engaging the caller for additional information. Please review the information below for additional information regarding these various types of fraud and how to avoid them.
