THE IMPACT OF CLIMATE MIGRATION ON THE UNITED STATES

Mathew Hauer is an Assistant Professor of Sociology at Florida State University who studies the impacts of climate change on society. Recently, his research focuses on how migration induced by sea level rise could reshape the U.S. population distribution. The New York Times, National Geographic, Time Magazine, Popular Science, USA Today, and others have featured his research. Drawing on population projections and demographic modeling, his talk will focus on how many people are at-risk to sea level rise in the United States, the destinations of likely migrants, potential adaptations, and how demographic and climate change could amplify environmental inequality and racism. Before coming to Florida State University, Dr. Hauer spent eight years directing the Applied Demography Program at the University of Georgia and was a statistician at the US Census Bureau.
