



Community Vulnerability

- defining characteristics of a group (indicators)
 - poverty, poor health, ethnic or racial minority status, etc.
 - can also include housing
- <u>combined with</u>: exposure (location and proximity to hazard)
- PROBLEMATIC
 - stereotyping, stigmatizing, blaming
 - lacks agency, perceptions, responses
 - overlooks micro-spatial contexts




Community Vulnerability: Importance of Perception, Agency & Identity




- RISK PERCEPTION REDUCERS
 - Fatalism
 - Personality and Biography
 - Low Danger
 - Special Protections
- VULNERABILITY PERCEPTION AND EVACUATION REDUCERS
 - belief in personal abilities, resilience
 - active, smart decision making
 - concerns about family unity, pets



Community Resilience

- High degree of conceptual uncertainty
- typically means (ecology):

"a system's ability to maintain its integrity and to return to its original state, a state of equilibrium, normality, when it is confronted with a disruption"



Community Resilience



- problematic on community level:
 - bias toward self-reliance, neoliberal responsibility
 - Implies a desire to reconstruct preexisting vulnerabilities, status quo
 - legitimizes inequality, exclusion
 - may prevent improvements in sustainability and social equity



Conclusion: Sociological Insights

- Overcoming "variables" and "indices" approach to vulnerability
- Inclusion of perception, agency, identity, diversity
- Accounting for social units (family, household, networks), social actors (pets)
- Community level impact analysis ("social body")
- Social justice considerations in resilience: toward adaptive/sustainable resilience
